Subj: Survey of USS OREGON CITY (CA-122)

1. USS OREGON CITY (CA-122) is one of two heavy cruisers of that class. The ship was commissioned in February 1946 and inactivated in December 1947. The ship has not been modernized. Considering current warfare requirements, the costs to activate and modernize USS OREGON CITY (CA-122) are disproportionate to the value of the ship.
2. The President, Board of Inspection and Survey has found USS OREGON CITY (CA-122) unfit for further Naval service and has recommended that she be stricken from the Naval Vessel Register. The Chief of Naval Operations concurs and recommends that USS OREGON CITY (CA-122) be stricken from the Naval Vessel Register on 1 November 1970 as provided for in Title 10, USC 7304.
3. Authority is requested to dispose of USS OREGON CITY (CA-122) pursuant to existing law in a manner most advantageous to the government, subsequent to striking as recommended in paragraph 2.above.
4. Pursuant to the requirements of Title 10, USC 7307 and because this ship has been found unfit as required by law, it is hereby certified that USS OREGON CITY (CA-122) is not essential to the defense of the United States.
